## 00: Market Update

It's been sixty days since the sunset of the buyer credit. Homes purchased with that incentive in mind have 8 days to close. Following the credit expiration there was a marked decrease in buyer activity. Sellers that were unable to get a buyer on the hook were left feeling uncertain what will come. We are going to look at a \$200,000 house, put 10% down and borrow 180,000 and have a monthly payment of \$912. That is using 4.5% and adding up just principal and interest. Let's say that this time next year interest rates climb to 7.5%, slightly higher than the rate was on my first FHA loan in 2002, the adjusted principal and interest payment is \$1259, that's \$350 more per month for the same exact house with the same exact price. From a different angle the problem looks like this, today you can afford a 200,000 home and a year from now you can go up to \$150,000. Which do you want to live in?
